FAQ's About Our Honey

- Our honey is considered to be raw & unfiltered—never heated above 100 degrees and only run through a sieve to remove larger bits of comb.
- Raw honey contains traces of pollen that cause 90% of all allergies. Raw honey can lessen the reaction to those allergens.
- Spring honey is usually much lighter and has a more delicate flavor than fall honey. This is due to the plants that the bees visit to gather the nectar.

Bees of the Woods uses minimal processing techniques that leave our honey as whole & natural as possible. Our honey contains traces of pollen, beeswax, and propolis which tend to make the honey appear cloudy compared to the heavily processed honey found on grocery store shelves. Raw honey contains enzymes that produce the delicate flavors associated with different nectar sources. Our raw honey is available in spring and fall wildflower blends.

Mallard Pond Maple Syrup

Mallard Pond Maple syrup is made from the same trees where our bees gather their nectar. 20 degree nights and 40 degree days gets

the sap flowing. In the spring sap is collected the old-fashioned way, with buckets, as well as with some tubing around our woods. It is then transferred to a tank that feeds a 2' x 6' wood-fired evaporator where it is boiled down to 66% sugar and bottled. The evaporator removes approximately 25 gallons of water per hour and on average we collect 2500 gallons of sap each season. It takes approximately 40 gallons of sap to make 1 gallon of sweet, Mallard Pond Maple syrup.



Mallard Pond Maple Syrup is available in 1/2 pint, pint, quart, and 1/2 gallon plastic jugs as well as glass novelty jars including a 250ml maple leaf for wedding or party favors.
